

Id Town. The name conjures up images of old buildings, long-forgotten history and people who lived that history. A tour of the area begins at the center: San Felipe de Neri Church. The original church, completed in 1719, was located west of the plaza (square), about where Romero's Basket Shop is today.

Nothing much changed until 1792 when the adobe church crumbled. Work began immediately on a bigger, sturdier church north of the plaza. This is the church you see today.

In 1846 the Union Army built a guardhouse/barbershop/dentist office where the gazebo stands today. In 1862, Confederates occupied Albuquerque for two months until Colorado Volunteers retook the town. Five flags have flown over the plaza—Spain, Mexico, US Territory, Confederate States of America, and finally the state of NM.

Father-son team Jim and John Hofsis, owners of Treasure House Books, have raised and lowered these flags daily for 43 years without missing once. Located directly across the plaza from the church, the original building housing Treasure House Books dates to the 1860s.

East of the plaza stands La Placita Restaurant which, around 1706. the prominent Armijo family built as a home. This adobe provided refuge from raiding Indians and housed soldiers from the Mexican, Spanish and American Civil Wars. Later, still occupied by the Armijo family, portions were used as a trading post. Check out the live cottonwood growing inside the restaurant and visit the Native artisans selling jewelry under the portal.

Walk north up San Felipe Street. On the street running behind the church is Church Street Café, opened in 1994. Originally a residence, built using terrones (an adobe brick made from marshy swamp) around 1709 in the classic old Spanish 'U-shape,' it remained this way until a 1920 flood destroyed half. It stayed in the Ruiz family until Rufina Ruiz died in 1991 at the age of 91, making this the oldest continuous residence in Old Town.

Around the corner on the west side of the church (Romero Street) is Trader Barbs, housed in Our Lady of the Angels boys' school. Built by Jesuit Fathers in 1877, it was the only public school in central New Mexico. In 1881, the Sisters of Charity took over teaching and invited girls to attend for the first time. Adjacent to its south is Sister Blandina Convent/Loyola Hall, built in 1881 for the sisters who had come to teach. It has served as a convent, school, post office and infirmary.

Across the street, next to the Basket Shop is Yay Yogurt and Amapola Gallery. This brick house, built in 1915 by Jesús Romero, a local grocer, functioned briefly as a dwelling for the Church's priest as well as for several decades, a home for unwed mothers. It was the last major home to be built on the plaza.





















isit the Village of Corrales, and step back in time to an era and place where life moved slowly and agriculture was king.

Casa San Ysidro and Old San Ysidro Church, both windows to the past, hold a special place in the hearts of locals. Casa integrates many generations of New Mexican creativity in its structure and its furnishings. The church holds the spiritual and emotional aspirations of centuries within her walls.

Casa was and still is a working farm, growing green chili and other traditional New Mexican crops. The difficulties of life in the 1800's is reflected in the severe portrait of Encarnación Gutiérrez hanging in the front hall.

Casa San Ysidro and Old San Ysidro Church are vital parts of the Corrales community today.

Old San Ysidro Church hosts many wonderful events. It is a unique venue for Music in Corrales, a yearly concerts series of classical, jazz, folk and more. Their speakers series presents historical and cultural information. The Church houses two major fine arts and crafts shows and a fiber art show every year. One of the Fine Arts Shows is now taking place during the week of the Balloon Fiesta. Do plan to attend.

Both Casa and the Old Church are treasured destination points during Corrales' seasonal celebrations, the Spring Heritage Festival and the Fall Harvest Festival.

The Village of Corrales holds other popular annual events. The Corrales Art Studio Tour and the Holiday Art Fest are favorites of art lovers. Families love the July 4th Parade, and the Winter Holiday Season starts with the Starlight Parade. Anytime is good to visit the local wineries, hike or ride on the trails of the Bosque along the river, and get fresh veggies at the vibrant Farmer's Market. Art abounds in Corrales with an active artist community and a Main Street lined with galleries, unique shops and fine restaurants.

All are welcome to experience the rich artistic and historical character of the village. Breathe in the sounds and scents of rural life; leave the stresses of modern life behind as you experience the mountains, river, forest and fields, history and culture of Corrales.

elcome to the Jemez Valley—a charming 30-mile drive just an hour from Albuquerque which will suit many interests, including spectacular scenery, history that goes back four centuries, and outdoor sports that range from hiking and climbing to premier fly fishing and wildlife viewing. This route is surrounded by national forest, and you are here at one of the most beautiful times of the year. The weather is perfect for hiking--or strolling—and an opportunity for photographers is around every bend. Cottonwoods along the Jemez River form a golden tunnel as you drive up Hwy. 4 to the famed hot springs and beyond into the mountains where aspen put on their autumn show. Unique geological features, such as tent rocks, Soda Dam and Battleship Rock, are fascinating any time of the year.


The Jemez Valley follows the meanders of the Jemez River. It is wide at the lower end where fields and low mesas surround Jemez Pueblo. As you drive north, elevation rises from 5500' to 7600', the canyon narrows, and the cliffs on either side rise to 1000' or more. At the half-way point between San Ysidro at the lowest end and the small community of LaCueva at the highest is the Village of Jemez Springs.

This tiny municipality (population 250) is home to hot mineral springs that have been a visitor destination for 150 years. Those wishing to "take the waters" will find both historic and modern facilities. The more adventurous may wish to explore primitive soaking pools in the forest.

While Jemez Springs has been a tourist destination for more than a century, archaeologists and oral history tell us that ancestors of the Jemez people were here hundreds of years before that. Jemez Historic Site, a state monument in Jemez Springs, preserves the ruins of a prehistoric Ancestral Puebloan village and the shell of a 17th century Catholic mission church.

Residents of the valley are the traditional New Mexico mix of three cultures: Native American, Hispanic and Anglo. Some families' fore-fathers and -mothers were here before the Spanish came in 1540, and some are descended from those Spanish pioneers. In addition to the old families, today's residents include retirees who love the landscape and the slow pace of rural life, anglers who prize the local streams, artisans and artists working in a wide variety of styles and media, and federal employees of the forest service and nearby national parks and preserves.


