

pear Friend of the SPCA of Anne Arundel County,

"No animal without a home" and "No Kill Shelter" are not just catch phrases, they are an embodiment of a cultural transformation at the SPCA that required comprehensive changes to processes and policies. A positive outcome for every cat, dog, bunny, and guinea pig, demands an individual approach to meet the unique challenges each animal brings. Frightened, confused, hungry, even abused these are just a brieflist of the emotions the animals possess as they pass through the doors of your shelter. As they do, they enter an environment filled with compassion, love and support. Today I share with you a brief behind the scenes look at how we have become a beacon of hope for the most vulnerable of our community.



Our process starts before an animal is surrendered to the SPCA. When possible, our incoming staff encourages pet owners to come in and share with us the reasons why they are separating from their pets. In some situations economic hardships lead owners to the gut retching decision to give up a cherished pet. Our food bank often provides a solution that keeps a pet in a loving home. Some owners are unable to handle behavioral challenges and we accept those animals with an assurance we will find them a home. While these animals wait to be adopted, our staff and volunteers begin behavior and enrichment programs. Trained experts supervise our staff and oversee therapeutic sessions as we have recognized mental and emotional well being are equally important as medical and physical care. The result has been countless stories of animals who would have been lost in other shelters are now the source of great joy in new homes. An additional key element of our "no kill policy" is our expanded foster program. Our gracious foster families open their hearts and homes to underage kittens/puppies, animals recovering from surgery, or to those that need to re-acclimate to living with people. Growing the number of foster families has meant more animals get the support they need to live successfully in a new home.

Examples such as helping pet owners with training, providing shelter pets with enrichment, and working closely with potential adopters are critical to our growing success. The most rewarding work that take place at the SPCA involves saving, protecting, and improving the lives of animals while enhancing the humane-animal bond. Finding the right home for EVERY pet is our passion. This cannot be done without the generous contributions of our donors.

Whether you adopt a pet from the SPCA, refer your friends to us, or send in a monthly donation in lieu of adoption, I am grateful for your support. The happiness and fulfillment shared by the pets, new owners and the SPCA staff and volunteers are also yours to enjoy.

She was found out in the elements chained so short that she couldn't even reach her puppies. Several of her puppies didn't make it due to extreme emaciation, dehydration, and maggot

infestation. The remaining healthy pups pulled through even though they had contracted ringworm. Chloe suffered minor illnesses and injuries which included hair loss around her neck from the collar and chain.



Even though Chloe had a rough past, she remains happy and loving. She's great around kids and very motivated with treat. Although she was a fantastic mother to her puppies, she doesn't prefer other pets. Now that Chloe's puppies all have been adopted, she is the only one that remains. Please consider visiting with Chloe today.

The SPCA is dedicated to giving each animal another chance at a happy, healthy life. In many cases, fostering an animal outside of a kennel atmosphere is necessary for their optimum health and care. SPCA LOBBY MAKEOVER

The SPCA's main shelter lobby renovation keeps on truckin'! After Remodel USA's installation of 40 new energy efficient windows valued over \$31,000 in 2014, Home Depot stepped up to help remodel the SPCA's main lobby. Our main lobby is a location where customers come to visit when they are interested in adopting an animal, it's a place where we meet with foster parents, and it's a place where our staff answers any questions customers have in regards to animal adoptions and care. The old lobby had paint chipped concrete floors, old carpeted walls, and outdated sales racks for our merchandise so it was due for a serious makeover. Home Depot's team and SPCA Staff & Volunteers partnered together to raise funds for the project as well as help with demolition and rebuilding. Now, the SPCA lobby has new hardwood floors, beautifully painted walls, and more space for our customers (and staff) to enjoy!



FOR OUR MOST RECENT WALK & RUN FOR THE ANIMALS EVENT, OVER 2,300 ANIMAL LOVERS SHOW UP TO SUPORT THE SPCA'S EVENT. THANKS TO OUR GENEROUS DONORS, WE HAVE EXCEEDED OUR GOAL OF \$220,000 AND MORE THAN \$230,000 WAS RAISED TO HELP THE SPCA'S LIFESAVING MISSION. 




Riley (Lyra)







SEVERAL OF THE DOGS THAT ARRIVED ARE UNDERGOING TREATMENT FOR HEARTWORMS AND OTHERS ARE AWAITING ADOPTION FOLLOWING THEIR TRANSPORT. UPON HEARING ABOUT THE UNKNOWN NUMBERS OF ANIMALS THAT HAVE BEEN DISPLACED BY THE FLOODS, THE SPCA JUMPED IN TO HELP. THE SPCA IS PART OF HSUS'S EMERGENCY PLACEMENT PARTNERS PROGRAM WHERE PARTNERS STEP IN TO HELP FIND HOMES FOR ANIMALS THAT ARE PART OF ANIMAL CRUELTY CASES AND NATURAL DISASTERS.




Charlie's travels to Alaska


